
A reading from the Book of Judges.

The Israelites again did what was evil in the sight of the LORD, after Ehud died. So the LORD sold them into the hand of King Jabin of Canaan, who reigned in Hazor; the commander of his army was Sisera, who lived in Harosheth-ha-goiim. Then the Israelites cried out to the LORD for help; for he had nine hundred chariots of iron, and had oppressed the Israelites cruelly twenty years. At that time Deborah, a prophetess, wife of Lappidoth, was judging Israel. She used to sit under the palm of Deborah between Ramah and Bethel in the hill country of Ephraim; and the Israelites came up to her for judgment. She sent and summoned Barak son of Abinoam from Kedesh in Naphtali, and said to him, "The LORD, the God of Israel, commands you, 'Go, take position at Mount Tabor, bringing ten thousand from the tribe of Naphtali and the tribe of Zebulun. I will draw out Sisera, the general of Jabin's army, to meet you by the Wadi Kishon with his chariots and his troops; and I will give him into your hand.""

The Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 5:1-11

A reading from the Book of First Thessalonians.

Now concerning the times and the seasons, brothers and sisters, you do not need to have anything written to you. For you yourselves know very well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night. When they say, "There is peace and security," then sudden destruction will come upon them, as labor pains come upon a pregnant woman, and there will be no escape! But you, beloved, are not in darkness, for that day to surprise you like a thief; for you are all children of light and children of the day; we are not of the night or of darkness. So then let us not fall asleep as others do, but let us keep awake and be sober; for those who sleep sleep at night, and those who are drunk get drunk at night. But since we belong to the day, let us be sober, and put on the breastplate of faith and love, and for a helmet the hope of salvation. For God has destined us not for wrath but for obtaining salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, who died for us, so that whether we are awake or asleep we may live with him. Therefore encourage one another and build up each other, as indeed you are doing.



His master said to him, 'Well done, good and trustworthy slave; you have been trustworthy in a few things, I will put you in charge of many things; enter into the joy of your master.' And the one with the two talents also came forward, saying, 'Master, you handed over to me two talents; see, I have made two more talents.' His master said to him, 'Well done, good and trustworthy slave; you have been trustworthy in a few things, I will put you in charge of many things; enter into the joy of your master.' Then the one who had received the one talent also came forward, saying, 'Master, I knew that you were a harsh man, reaping where you did not sow, and gathering where you did not scatter seed; so I was afraid, and I went and hid your talent in the ground. Here you have what is yours.' But his master replied, 'You wicked and lazy slave! You knew, did you, that I reap where I did not sow, and gather where I did not scatter? Then you ought to have invested my money with the bankers, and on my return I would have received what was my own with interest. So take the talent from him, and give it to the one with the ten talents. For to all those who have, more will be given, and they will have an abundance; but from those who have nothing, even what they have will be taken away. As for this worthless slave, throw him into the outer darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.""

For Borderland Ministries of the Episcopal Diocese of the Rio Grande, aiding thousands of asylum seekers seeking shelter along the Border.

For *Lay Ministers Education in Lesotho, Southern Africa*, providing training to Lay Ministers to lead congregations in mountainous regions of the country.

For *Abraço Negro*, fostering greater acceptance of African-heritage and indigenous traditions within mainstream Christianity in Brazil.

For *Ruth and Jim Padilla DeBorst*, promoting creation care and theological education in an intentional community in Costa Rica, especially as they cultivate their new project, Casa Nube.

Almighty God, Source of all that is, Giver of every good gift:

we confess that we have failed to honor you

in the great diversity of the human family.

We have desired to live in freedom,

while building walls between ourselves and others.

Forgive us, Holy God.

Give us eyes to see you as you are revealed in all people.

Strengthen us for the work of reconciliation rooted in love.

Restore us in your image, to be beloved community, united in our diversity,

even as you are one with Christ and the Spirit, Holy and undivided Trinity, now and for ever. Amen.

A moment in silence is now kept, not to dwell in unnecessary self-criticism or self-hatred, but rather to face our brokenness with courage and honesty that we might know more deeply God's healing and forgiving love.



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The Presider says

Life-giving God, you made all people and all things in a world of glory, and taught us to live together in love forever.

And though we turned from your light and made war on one another, wasting the gifts of your creation,

until we could find no way out of the darkness, even then you did not destroy or forsake us.

The People then say

You called Sarah and Abraham on a journey of promise, and brought Israel out of captivity; you made Moses your friend, and taught him to grow in the truth. And in due time the new star of glory appeared, scattering the shadows of death and leading us on the road to peace.

The Presider says

Our eyes at first were dim: we could not make him out. We wondered as he taught us the way of your kingdom; we fled in fear when he died for us, showing the fullness of love.

The People then say

But you raised him again,

and in his new dawn the truth shone plainly for all to see.

Now we have cast down our fears; we have turned our faces full to the light.

And so, we join in love once more, to follow his example and share his glorious life in the breaking of bread.

The Presider says

For on the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given to thanks to you, he broke it and gave it to his disciples and said—

"Take, eat: This is my body, which is given for you.

Do this in remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them and said— "Drink of this, all of you:

This is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

The People then say

Therefore, God, we offer you this bread and this wine. We offer them gladly, as Jesus told us, giving thanks for his life, his death, and his resurrection.

The Presider says

Now send us your Holy Spirit, to show that this bread and cup are the life-giving body and blood of your Son, and reveal your image in us, transforming our life to be like his and bring us at the last to his commonwealth of peace.

All then say together

Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, all honor and glory are yours, Almighty God and Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, for ever and ever. AMEN.

And lead us not into temptation,


but deliver us from evil.

All are welcome and encouraged to receive Communion from God's table.




