

The First Reading: Isaiah 9:2-7

A reading from the Book of Isaiah.

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness-on them light has shined. You have multiplied the nation, you have increased its joy; they rejoice before you as with joy at the harvest, as people exult when dividing plunder. For the yoke of their burden, and the bar across their shoulders, the rod of their oppressor, you have broken as on the day of Midian. For all the boots of the tramping warriors and all the garments rolled in blood shall be burned as fuel for the fire. For a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. His authority shall grow continually, and there shall be endless peace for the throne of David and his kingdom. He will establish and uphold it with justice and with righteousness from this time onward and forevermore. The zeal of the Lord of hosts will do this.

- He will judge the world with righteousness * and the peoples with his truth.


A reading from the Book of Titus.

The Holy Gospel: Luke 2:1-14

Presider The Holy Gospel of our Savior Jesus Christ according to Luke.*People* Glory to you, O Christ.

In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All went to their own towns to be registered. Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see-- I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!"

Sermon

Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary, and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father, who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified. who has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Let us pray to God who came among us in the birth of Jesus.

Gracious God, as a star rose, and drew people from great distances to Bethlehem that they might greet the Christ-child; Draw us, your Church, and all of your people to you – that we might be the Church and the People who you call us to be.

In your mercy, Hear our prayer.

As you gave Mary your Holy Spirit, filling her with the delight of your presence; Fill us with your Spirit, that in these hard times, you might renew our lives with hope and joy.

In your mercy, Hear our prayer.

As Gentiles streamed to Jesus's light, and kings to the brightness of his rising; Draw our nation, our government, and all in any authority to your brightness.

In your mercy, Hear our prayer.

As angels sang 'glorias' to you and proclaimed peace on earth, and goodwill among all peoples; Bring us your peace, and bring an end to all war, terror, hatred, and strife, in particular in the Holy Land of Jesus's birth.

As shepherds were drawn from their flocks by night; Draw those who do not yet know you to the knowledge and love of you.

As Jesus was born in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn; Be especially present with those who have nowhere to lay their head, those who are vulnerable, and those who are hungry.

In your mercy, Hear our prayer.

As your Son was born into a time of darkness, we pray for all who are anxious, depressed, or ill. Draw near to those who find this season a source of pain or grief, and to all who are suffering or sick that they may feel the comfort of this holy night.

In your mercy, Hear our prayer.

As the Holy Family gathered together in Bethlehem, and traveled together to far off lands; Bless all families, especially the families of our parish, and protect those who travel.

In your mercy, Hear our prayer.

And as the Holy Family soon thereafter fled to Egypt to escape persecution of those in power, we ask for your blessing upon all refugees and immigrants and an end to all forms of racism and injustice.

In your mercy, Hear our prayer.

As your Son came to proclaim the gift of life eternal; Give to the departed eternal rest and let light perpetual shine on them.

In your mercy, Hear our prayer.

Let us now pray for our own needs and those of others, aloud or in silence.

The Presider then says

O Lord our God, may the light and hope of this night, and of your Son's Incarnation, reassure our hearts that you are among us, that you hear our prayer, and that you will be with us always, even to the end of the age. In the name of Jesus of Nazareth we pray. **Amen.**

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The Presider continues

We especially give you thanks for coming to live among us. For tonight we celebrate the birth of your child Jesus, our savior. We thank you for Mary his mother and Joseph his father. We remember how he was born poor and humble, and like the star of Bethlehem, which announced his birth, he showed us the way we need to follow and the truth we need to know. We remember that he lived, died and rose again to bring us your light and your love.

We remember that on the night he died for us, our savior Jesus took bread. And when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his friends and said, "Take, eat: this is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine. And when he had given thanks, he gave it to his friends and said, "Drink this, all of you: this is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

And so with this bread and wine, we taste your goodness and tender loving care of each one of us. Send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts, that we who receive Christ's body may indeed be the body of Christ, and we who share his cup may draw strength from the one born on this night to bring us eternal life. Let the little child lead us to lives of faith, humility and courage, in our community, in the world, in his name.

All this we ask through your child, our Savior Jesus Christ. May praise, glory and love be yours, this and every day, from us and all people, here and everywhere. AMEN.


